FIRST VOICE OF THE PUBLIC (Agenda items only)

Robert Luisi 813 Central Ave inquired about the letter on the agenda under correspondence from the Planning Board Attorney regarding sidewalk construction. He reminded that he had been at a meeting about sidewalks and is request not to install sidewalks since in his neighborhood no one has them.

Mr. Vorbach asked about this letter, Attorney Raffetto stated that the letter conveys that the Planning Boards recommendation is maintain the requirement of sidewalk installation.

Councilman Vorbach stated that it doesn't seem reasonable. Councilwoman Cindea added that she has a sidewalk but none of her neighbors do, so it's a sidewalk going nowhere. Mr. Delaney added that council has copies of correspondence from Mr. Luisi and another resident, as well as an original memo sent to the Planning Board from Council with some alternatives. Mrs. Cindea added that there have not been several homes built with sidewalk waivers, and that there isn't consistency. Mayor Maccanico added that the council will be discussing this.

Andrew & Jennifer Yousseff 800 Jersey Ave. stated that he too built a new home with a temporary CO contingent on curb and sidewalk installation. He was hoping that a variance could be granted, so that he could get his certificate of occupancy. He added that his neighbors were not in favor of the sidewalk.

Robert Luisi 813 Central Ave read from a letter with neighbor residents listed that did not want a sidewalk. On a motion by Mr. Diver, seconded by Mr. Vorbach, the public comment period was closed without objection.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

■ Correspondence from Board Attorney George McGill re: Planning Board review of ordinance requiring construction of curbs and sidewalks (§22-507).

Mr. Tienken voiced that it seems to be very inconsistent.

Mr. Diver feels that keeping the curbing is important but feels that sidewalks could be eliminated with the exception of high traffic roads. Mr. Vorbach stated he agreed. Mrs. King suggested having the Police Dept. review which roads were heavily traveled.

Mr. Delaney added that the Planning Board would like to see the sidewalk/curb ordinance remain but yet the Board of Adjustment does grant waivers when residents are before them. Mr. Delaney suggested that possibly a reduced application process with reduced fees might be a way to go for sidewalk waivers. Attorney Raffetto was directed to draft an ordinance keeping the curb requirement and that sidewalks would still be mandated in heavy traffic areas. Again, Mrs. King added that the Police Department needs to be included. Attorney Raffetto stated that this would be referred to the Planning Board.

• East Point Engineering proposal for Rain Garden Drainage Improvements

Mr. Delaney reminded council that with the approval of the B3 Business Zone, there was discussion about

using a rain garden as part of stormwater management. Mr. May has identified 3 areas on borough property that we may want to consider this option. One area is at the back of the Municipal Building, another on Park Avenue and on Railroad Avenue. All of the work could be done in house. Mr. Delaney added that Mr. May has provided a proposal to address these areas, if council agrees, we would need an approval to move forward.
