## **PUBLIC COMMENT (Any item)**

Rich Carragher 916 Prospect Avenue asked Mayor and Council to revisit the bulk trash pick-up schedule for

2017. A lot of residents are only here on weekends, they put the trash out and now it's not picked up until Thursday. Mr. Herner stated that he had recently spoken to Mrs. King about this, he was in agreement that it should be moved back to Mondays.

- Rita Murphy 2014 Highway 71 inquired as to the vendors that have done work at the tennis courts in the 2 parks, she asked if it was the same vendor for both jobs. Mr. Herner stated the tennis courts had Ocean Rd were done earlier, it was just basketball only but at Allaire Road it was both the tennis and basketball courts were done. Mr. Delaney confirmed the same. Mrs. Murphy asked if it was one contractor: Mr. Delaney replied yes, it was one project. She asked about the 20% of the project costs for accessibility upgrades. Mr. Delaney explained that those improvements to the parks are not governed by the construction code, and therefore not a requirement. That requirement was described by the architect as he talked about the proposed improvements to the community center building. Mr. Delaney pointed out that Allaire Road Park had improvements to the playground which include accessibility upgrades. She felt the path to the area wasn't compliant. She stated that there aren't paths to gain access to the tennis courts except grass, in her opinion it isn't the proper surface.
- Mr. Vorbach asked Mr. Delaney if the improvements to the Community Center building include making the necessary upgrades for accessibility, Mr. Delaney replied yes.
- Ms. Murphy explained that the paths to the courts aren't proper; she presented pictures that showed the sidewalks aren't even at Ocean Road Park.
- Mayor O'Brien asked her to leave the information that she had and what she felt needed the work and we'll see what work could get done. Mr. Herner suggested that the first question would be what is the considered a proper surface.
- Mr. Vorbach offered that any future grants obtained for park improvements that they would include making any necessary ADA improvements, Mr. Delaney agreed. Mr. Delaney stated that he was sure at the time the improvements were done that they met the requirements at that time.
