Due to the current situation and in accordance with governor's executive orders, residents are reminded to stay home unless absolutely necessary. If you must go outside, please observe social distance guidelines and practice good hygiene. Please remember that children can be carriers without exhibiting symptoms.

If you have children in your home, speak with them about the importance of social distancing and avoid having them play with other children not living in the same home.

Borough buildings, including the recycling center, remain closed to the public until further notice.

The public works department wishes to remind residents that collections are in according to the existing schedule in our borough calendar. No modifications to the schedule have been made. Trash in cans must be bagged for collection. Loose items thrown in cans will not be able to be collected.

Residents must put all trash, recycling, brush, and bulky trash out for collection to the curb by 7am on their designated day in accordance with the borough calendar. In order to limit exposure of our public works employees, anyone who does not have items to the curb prior to collection on their block must wait until the next designated day for pickup. Due to limited staff and protection measures in place, we will not be sending crews back to pickup items that were not out for collection at the designated time. Again, items must be to the curb by 7AM.

I appreciate everyone's effort as we work through this very difficult time. With all of your cooperation, I am confident in our community's ability to overcome the challenges before us.
