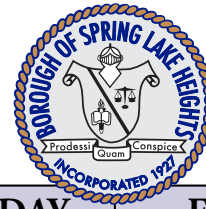

So what can you do?



WHAT'S THE PROBLEM WITH MOTOR OIL?

Oil does not dissolve in water. When motor oil runs into storm drains either from changing your car's oil or from leaky cars, it goes directly to our lakes, rivers and the ocean. Oil and other petroleum products are toxic and can contaminate your drinking water, as well as kill fish, wildlife and plants. Did you know that one pint of oil can make a slick larger than a football field? Used motor oil is the largest single source of all oil pollution in lakes, streams and rivers. Americans spill 180 million gallons of used oil each year into our waters.

YOU CAN HELP!

- Keep your car well maintained.
- Regularly check your car for leaks and schedule tune-ups. If you find leaks or drips, have your car repaired.
- Take your car to a service center to change the oil.
- If you do change your own oil, do it in a garage, never on the street. Use a self-contained oil pan and discard the oil at a local service center for recycling.
- NEVER discard oil, gas, or antifreeze into a storm drain.
- If you spill hazardous fluids, contain it immediately with rags and cat litter. Clean up the spill and properly dispose of the waste.

WHY SHOULD YOU CARE ABOUT CLEAN WATER?

Stormwater pollution is one of the greatest threats to New Jersey's clean water supply. Clean water provides access to safe drinking water, a place for recreation, commercial opportunities, healthy wildlife habitats, and adds beauty to our landscape. Rain washes pollution from streets, parking lots, and lawns into storm drains, then directly into streams, rivers, lakes and the ocean.

Did you know more than 60 percent of water pollution comes from things like motor oil, fertilizers, pet waste, and detergents? By sharing the responsibility and making small, easy changes in our daily lives, we can keep common pollutants out of stormwater.

So what can you do?



WHAT'S THE PROBLEM WITH FERTILIZERS AND PESTICIDES?

Fertilizers help plants grow by adding nutrients to the soil. Pesticides (including herbicides) are any toxic substances used to kill insects, animals or plants. If fertilizers or pesticides are improperly applied, they can wash off your lawn or garden into storm drains and directly to our lakes, rivers, and the ocean. These chemicals can contaminate your drinking water, as well as kill fish, wildlife and plants. Too much fertilizer washing into a lake can cause algae to bloom in lakes, which will affect swimming, fishing and boating.

YOU CAN HELP!

- Test your soil at your County's Rutgers Cooperative Research and Extension office, or buy a self-test kit.
- Use natural, slow-release nitrogen, or low phosphorus fertilizers.
- Look into natural alternatives to fertilizers and pesticides, such as integrated pest management (IPM).
- If you need to use fertilizers or pesticides, follow the instructions on the label on how to correctly apply.
- Do not apply fertilizers or pesticides before it rains. This will not allow the fertilizers or pesticides to penetrate through the soil.
- Use drought-resistant native plants in gardens; they require less fertilizer and less water.
- Use a mulching mower instead of bagging grass clippings.

• GARBAGE, TRASH & RECYCLING REGULATIONS •

Must be out by 7:00 am the day of pick-up.

Collections may be cancelled during SNOWSTORMS and other WEATHER EMERGENCIES.

After snow events please place your garbage and recycling to the curb or shovel an adequate path to provide safe access.




GARBAGE Only garbage which is generated in the Borough will be collected from residential and commercial users.

- Loose garbage in a can will NOT BE COLLECTED.
- Collection is limited to three (3) containers per collection date.
- *Containers must have handles and cannot exceed 32 gallons in size.*
- Loaded containers in excess of 50 lbs. weight will not be collected.
- Containers must be kept sanitary and free of water and ice.
- Containers at the curb should be placed no earlier than the night before and no later than 7:00 a.m. on the collection date. Empty containers cannot be left at the curb overnight or on weekends.
- Except where curbside collection is required (condominiums) containers may also be placed for collection at any accessible site in the rear yard. There will be **no collection from fenced yards** or where free access is hampered. Email sanitation@springlakehts.com to begin this service.

VEGETATIVE WASTE

- **BRUSH** and branches (maximum 6 feet length or 12 inches diameter) can be placed curbside on scheduled dates. This collection is for tree pruning **not whole trees**. Quantity is limited to a single pile not exceeding 5 feet wide, 5 feet high and 10 feet long. Small clippings (twigs, vines and hedge trimmings) should be separated from larger brush and placed curbside in a sturdy open-top container no earlier than 2 days before scheduled brush collection dates.
- **LEAVES** must be placed loose in piles along the curb or street edge no earlier than 2 days before scheduled collection and must be at least 10 feet from all storm-water drainage inlets. Leaves CANNOT be mixed with vines, twigs, brush. Bagged leaves CANNOT be collected.
- **GRASS CLIPPINGS** are strictly prohibited, **will not** be collected and are not accepted at the Spring Lake Heights Recycling Center. Residents are encouraged to "cut it and leave it" to improve the health of your lawn.
- **NO BAMBOO - SMALL** quantities can be collected on BULK TRASH days.

RECYCLING The following materials must be separated for collection:

- **MIXED PAPER:** newspapers, magazines, catalogs, office paper, junk mail, flattened cardboard and paperboard (cereal boxes) can be placed in the same container for collection.
- **BOTTLES & CANS:** plastic   **OR** , glass, tin or aluminum bottles, jars and cans can be placed in the same container for collection.

Place recyclables in sturdy, open-top containers not exceeding 32 gallons or 50 lbs. weight. **(RECYCLING IN A PLASTIC BAG WILL NOT BE COLLECTED)**

- **NO STYROFOAM** - Throw out with household garbage.

BULK TRASH Any trash which cannot be placed in a container, including household furniture and appliances, can be placed curbside for collection no earlier than 2 days before scheduled **BULK TRASH** dates. **BULK TRASH IS NOT INTENDED FOR HOUSE CLEANOUTS OR MOVING. ONLY** reasonable amounts will be collected. All metal should be placed in a separate pile.

- **APPLIANCES** and electronics (TVs, computers) should be placed curbside for collection on BULK TRASH dates. Please remove refrigerator doors.
- **CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS:** only small quantities from routine maintenance (no fencing or sheds) will be collected on **BULK TRASH** dates. Email sanitation@springlakehts.com to arrange for disposal of small quantities of concrete material or bricks.

OTHER ITEMS

- **BATTERIES** (household) can be discarded with regular garbage.
- **PAINT CANS** (empty) and dried latex paint should be discarded with regular garbage. (Paint hardener is available at hardware stores.)
- **MOTOR OIL** can be taken to any motor vehicle re-inspection station.
- **TIRE** disposal - Monmouth County Reclamation Center in Tinton Falls.
- **Monmouth County Permanent Household Hazardous Waste Facility (732-683-8686)** in Tinton Falls for pesticides, fertilizers, motor oil, antifreeze, pool chemicals, car batteries, gasoline and oil paints.
